# NORTHEAST STRIPED BASS STUDY

Trolling motor technology has revolutionized how many people fish for fluke, tautog and stripers at the Jersey Shore. Trolling motors paired with navigation electronics allow you to pinpoint your drift and put you on the exact spot you want to be, or, once you find the fish, put you back on that same drift. Trolling motors also allow you to fish in less-than-optimal conditions such as wind against the tide.

Every angler must start somewhere—just as Phil did ten years ago. Now a self-confessed tuna addict, Capt. A popular species on the offshore grounds every summer, mahi (aka dolphin and dorado) can also be found along the midrange and inshore waters where savvy captains are loading up around the pots, markers and buoys. Gear up for some offshore excitement close to port this season with a seasoned Jersey Shore charter captain.

Since 2019, a revolutionary study by Gray FishTag Research and *The Fisherman* has deployed mini satellite tags on post-spawn striped bass off the Atlantic Coast. The tags record salinity, depth, temperature, and location before detaching from the fish after a pre-set intervals. The findings from those tags have been eye opening and may someday disrupt the dogma of migratory striper beliefs.
